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

FEMALE TO MALE STUDENT RATIO





JOBS ON THE BLOCK


Jobs on the block is a job fair held in West Englewood. It provides the community a chance to speak to diferrent employers and recruiters to become potential employees.




STUDENT SPOTLIGHTS 12


Adetoye Samuel TRiO Alum

TRiO Alum


